





I've developed a new process for making Avialae when chapter 2 started, so I thought I would do a step by step guide of how I work for patrons!

I start off with a scanned image of the thumbnail for the page. I make it a light blue in MangaStudioEX and blow it up to my working size, $\sim 7.5"x12"$



I then loosely set the type for the page and format the panels. I move these around as needed, though I always end up resetting the type because typesetting in MangaStudio is awful.



I then loosely sketch over the thumbnail, moving and adjusting compositions as I see fit.




I then do tighter pencils over the loose sketch. I try not to make these too detailed since I have no self control with detail when I start inking.


I used to do pencils traditionally, but they took too long and I'm far more accurate with my digital pencils.



I then print out the page in a 15% cyan. I knock out the bluelines in photoshop after the page is scanned in, but it has to be pretty light in order to disappear completely.



I start inking by doing the word bubbles. Having the words typeset beforehand is nice for this since you don't have to worry about making the word bubbles the right size.



I then ink the foreground characters. I ink the backgrounds with a different pen, so I tend to ink from foreground to background to figure out where the background should end. I wait to fill in the blacks until I have everything inked.



I use a ruler and a thin pen to do the backgrounds. I do most of the perspective work in my pencils in MangaStudio, so this part is pretty easy. I also ink the background characters and fill in any blacks and yell while I wonder why all of my characters have impossible to ink hair.



I usually let my inks dry overnight before I do inkwash. It's dry to the touch within minutes, but the ink has to cure a bit before water can be put over it without bleeding. I do the basic shading and background effects with inkwash. I use a gray ink so I don't get too dark with my tones, but I will sometimes use a darker ink if needed.



I then use markers to do darker flats and shades. Usually I am cursing either Gannet's wings or Bailey's hair or their dark stupid uniform while doing this.



It's freckle time! ;_; This page isn't too bad for the freckles, but I do all of them by hand so I want to die when Gannet takes off his shirt;;; I use two light gray markers to make all of the dots. I've tried doing this digitally, but it never looks as good. :'(




After the page is done, I scan it in and make any needed edits in Photoshop. I drop it in a template I made for print and size it to the margins. I make the panel borders with a rough-edged white brush (protip: hold down shift in Photoshop to make straight lines). I also re-typeset the words and save a pdf version for print.




